





Introducing LEAP Awards



What is LEAP?

- An annual recognition awards program to recognize sites that achieve significant milestones in best practices for healthy eating and physical activity
- Determined by practices measured on Learn-setting SLAQs

Who is eligible for a LEAP award?

 Schools, out-of-school time (OST) programs, and early care and education (ECE) sites that complete and submit a Learn-setting SLAQ





How does it work?

There are two ways sites can earn a LEAP award.

1. Comprehensive accomplishment of best practices across the different areas measured on the SLAQ in three tiers

Gold

Silver



Bronze



2. Accomplishments for best practices in five specific areas





Physical Activity



Gardens



Family Engagement





To assign gold-silver-bronze tiers, SLAQ sections were classified as Core and Complementary using IWP guidance:

"Core" sections ask primarily about practices related to core IWP strategies, which are considered essential to intervention effectiveness

"Complementary" sections ask primarily about practices related to complementary IWP strategies, which should be implemented in conjunction with core strategies



How tiered awards are assigned



Gold

70% score in all **core sections**

0

70% score in 2 or morecomplementary sections



Silver

70% score in all **core sections**



70% score in 1complementary section



Bronze

70% score in all **core sections**

^{*}Section 4 of OST and ECE SLAQs includes both gardens and nutrition education. Only nutrition education questions are included in tier calculations. Garden questions are only counted for the Garden Badge.

How badges are assigned



Nutrition 70% of possible points across all nutrition questions



Physical Activity 70% of possible points across all physical activity questions



Gardens 70% of possible points across all garden questions



Family Engagement 70% of possible points across all family engagement questions



Breastfeeding Support 70% of possible points across all breastfeeding support questions

What will LEAP awardees receive?

- LEAP awards include a digital promotion package each site can use to share their accomplishments:
 - Certificate
 - Web graphics
 - Social media templates
 - Newsletter template

When are awards given?

- NPI uses SLAQs submitted by the end of each fiscal year to determine awards
- Award notifications are shared each September
