State Field Day Report by MJ Vann

This year's 4-H State Leadership Conference at UC Davis was full of adventures. At the conference, 4-Hers had the opportunity to interact with kids from all across the state, and we all shared one common goal: to learn more about leadership.

There were several things on the itinerary. Members enjoyed a keynote address from Mike Smith, an entrepreneur who founded his own skatepark and later converted it into a school. He discussed how we can make the world a better place by helping in any way we can. Then the 4-Hers headed into different workshops to learn more about leadership.

One of the first workshops was put on by the 4-H State Ambassadors. They taught about sparking passions, connections, and growth through the 4-H program. They taught that looking through our windows gives us a glimpse into new and different perspectives. Finding your window will help you discover your passions, build healthy bonds, and foster a sense of community.



Another workshop participants went to was "Agreements: A Deep Dive into Working Together." In this workshop, 4-Hers learned how to work in a team and how to let others have a voice by stepping forward and stepping back.

In one of the last workshops, "Root and Renewal: Integrating Nature to Support Your Well-being," 4-Hers learned how to take a break and stay calm, even when things are stressful, as any leader should know how to do.

The evenings were filled with fun, whether you were at the bowling alley, the dance, or the trinket trade. At the bowling alley, you could be bowling, playing video games, or playing pool. During the Dance, everyone was boogieing and partying with their friends. While at the trinket trade, participants traded items that represented their county, or they could run around and play all the available games.



This is accomplished through healthy eating, physical activity, relationship building, emotion regulation, injury prevention, and reduction of mind-altering substances.
