



Presentation Day Basics

• USE the presentation manual (the manual can be found here: https://ucanr.edu/sites/default/files/2024-10/403489.pdf or scan the QR code

There are 11 presentation types

County qualifies for regional and regional qualifies for State.

Let's take a look at 4 of the most popular entries, Demonstration, Illustrated Talk, Educational Display Talk and Interpretive Reading.

- Demonstrations are presentations that tell an audience how to make something as you physically
 perform the steps during your presentation. Poster boards used during your demonstration are
 used to highlight the major parts of your presentation. DO NOT use a tri-fold board.
- Illustrated Talks rely on visual aids, such as charts, illustrations, graphics, cut-outs etc. to explain your presentation topic to an audience. Poster boards used during your illustrated talk are used to highlight the major parts of your presentation. DO NOT use a tri-fold board.
- Educational Display Talks are an entire presentation displayed on a tri-fold board. All of the information to completely convey the presentation topic should be on the board. During the verbal portion of your Educational Display Talk, you DO NOT present your presentation; instead, you explain who you are, introduce the topic of your ed. display, explain why you picked the topic, etc. Then the judges come read your ed. display. Then the judges ask you questions about your ed. display.
- Interpretive Readings have always been a favorite for primary aged youth. They pick a favorite poem or a passage from a book and read it to the audience. Prior to the reading they introduce the name of the author, the plot, the characters, etc., so that the audience will be ready to enjoy and understand the reading.

Next month I will review 4 of the other types of presentations. In the meantime, please, please, flip through the presentation manual. Literally, flip through it front to back. Or back to front if that works for you. Get the gist of wat is in the manual. Everything needed to have a successful presentation is in the manual.


