

Enrollment fees for 2025-2026 are \$77 per youth and \$28 per adult

Fees are payable to your 4-H club and must be received by your club leader before enrollment can be approved.

Enrollment due dates:

- Members planning to sell livestock at the 2026 Trinity County Fair must be an approved member by December 1, 2025.
- Returning volunteers must be an approved volunteer by December 1, 2025 to continue without a break in service. This new date is a change in State 4-H policy starting this year.

This scholarship is open to Trinity County youth 9-18 years old who are producing a livestock project for the 2026 Trinity County Fair.

- ❖ \$500 scholarship with \$100 pay-it-forward payment made to the scholarship fund
- Funds may only be used to purchase and care for a project animal
- All requirements for the livestock project must be met, and a 4-H leader or FFA advisor must oversee the project

This scholarship is in memory of Korson Coulter who was a Trinity County 4-H member for six years. He competed in showmanship and market competitions with turkeys, rabbits and goats. Korson was always eager to help anyone with what needed to be done and to learn from others in order to be the best at what he set out to do.




Trinity County Fair Market Animal Project Participation

Now that the details associated with the 2025 Trinity County Fair are wrapping up, I started to reflect on the number of youth positively impacted by the fair through the market animal program as compared to the number of youth enrolled locally in 4-H. In the 2024-2025 program year, 70 4-H youth exhibited and sold livestock at the fair. This year's livestock auction participation trended down. This is likely a function of the avian flu and that no poultry could be exhibited at the fair. Figure A outlines the total number of lots sold at the fair between 2010 and 2025.




Youth can participate in this program as 4-H, FFA, Grange, or Independent exhibitors. Determining the number of exhibitors is a little challenging in that participants can sell two animals. Exhibitors were only counted once regardless of the number of lots sold. The number of exhibitors trended slightly down this year. Figure B outlines the number of exhibitors between 2010 and 2025.

It is interesting to look at the importance of market animal projects. In the 2024-2025 program year, there were 126 youth participating in 4-H in Trinity County. Of these, 23 were primary members (recall they cannot participate in market animal projects) and 103 were members that could participate in animal projects. Of the 103, 70 members had market animal projects equaling about 68% participation. Figure C shows the percent of youth choosing to participate in market animal projects out of the total number enrolled in 4-H.



This underscores that market animal projects remain an important component of the 4-H program locally and are a valuable youth engagement opportunity. As population and demographics in the county change, we need to understand the educational needs of local youth and look for opportunities to address these needs.
