Dear 4-H Volunteer,

Thank you for volunteering to help in the Dessert Booth at the Farm Bureau Crab Feed on Saturday, January 17, 2025. Please arrive 10-15 minutes before your scheduled shift to receive instructions and ensure a smooth transition between shifts. Volunteers for the Dessert Booth will check in at Flaherty Hall (where the event is taking place) and sign in at the Dessert Booth.

Please be sure to eat dinner before your shift, as meals are not provided for volunteers, and the event will be very busy once it begins. We want everyone to feel their best while representing 4-H!

Glenn County Farm Bureau asks that you wear a white, button-up collared shirt with clean denim pants, your 4-H hat, and tie/scarf. We will provide serving gloves for each member and adult. It is wise to wear **comfortable shoes**, as you will be on your feet while volunteering in the Dessert Booth.

Parent volunteers and 4-H members will be required to follow proper food safety practices, including wearing gloves, avoiding touching food with bare fingers, washing hands with soap and water, and restraining hair away from food.

It is essential to conduct yourself in a professional manner and maintain a neat and presentable appearance. Many people attending the Farm Bureau Crab Feed Dinner are generous supporters of the 4-H Program, and we want to represent 4-H well!

You will be responsible for helping package desserts, selling desserts, and handling cash. Depending on the time of your shift, you may also assist with set-up or clean-up. It is important that you stay for the full duration of your shift.
