# Thank Assembly Members who voted for HR 66, or share impact statements

You are encouraged to write a **handwritten thank you note** to your Assembly representative who voted for the Resolution or an impact statement if they were unable to vote. Go to <a href="https://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/">https://leginfo.legislature.ca.gov/</a> to identify your representative and see how they voted. (Note: many members were not present that day and did

not have the ability to cast a vote. A "NVR" or "no vote record" does not necessarily mean they don't support the Resolution.

### Letter Content & Style

- Content of the letter should include a "thank you for your support".
- What 4-H means to you. How has it impacted your life and community, i.e.: "Through my 4-H project I have learned how to bake cookies and gave them to a senior center" or "I raised my first rabbit."
- · If this is your first letter to a public official let them know:
- "As part of National 4-H Week. Oct 5-11, my club is partipating in a civic engagement project. As part of this project, I learned how to look up state legislation, identify voting records and find my representative."
- As an alternative you can create a group card and include a photo of your club activities. Really the sky is the limit. It is just about thanking people for their support.

# Letter Writing Tips

- Make it personal. "I am a constituent and want to thank you for supporting or recognizing the October 5-11
  as National 4-H Week." Explain what 4-H means to you and your community.
- Be gracious. Express your appreciation. Please speak to your positive experiences with 4-H and National 4-H Week
- We recommend you send a handwritten note, and even a handmade card! Legislative offices receive a lot of mail and this makes your note stand out to them.

### Additional Tips

- Staff or club organizer can supply stationery and set time aside at a monthly meeting to write the thank you notes. Encourage 4-H youth and volunteers to write letters.
- Assign one individual to collect and bring letters to the County 4-H Office in your UCCE office. County 4-H Staff will send them to the UC ANR State Office for hand delivery to the Capitol.
- 3. Share how to look up representatives on the web, and the other listed tips with your 4-H Community.

Lassen County Dog Project



# Youth Cycling Project


