QUALIFICATIONS & REQUIREMENTS:

- Graduating High School Senior
- Enrolled in Shasta County 4-H for at least the past three years: sophomore, junior, and senior years.
- Complete the entire application process by the due date, and attend a scholarship interview.
Interviews will take place on Thursday, April 9, 2026.
- If awarded a scholarship, you must enroll at a recognized college, university or trade school within 12 months of the date of the award or all monies shall be forfeited.

Letters can be from a leader from another club.
Community Club Leader / Project Leader / School official, employer, church official, etc.

PLEASE NOTE:

Applicants are responsible for verifying that all parts of the application are received by the 4-H Office on or before the due date. The application may be mailed or hand delivered. It is the applicants responsibility to follow up with the persons writing the letters of recommendation and insure they are received by the 4-H Office.

Letters of recommendation may be included with the application in a sealed envelope or mailed/delivered separately.

Incomplete applications will be disqualified. Late applications will not be accepted.
