Fashion Revue – the Event



- **DATE: MAY 2, 2026**
- **THEME: BLOOMING WITH STYLE**
- **Online General Entry & payment due April 14th (ONLINE ONLY)**
- **Fee: \$10 per entry.** Fees must be submitted to the 4-H Office by **April 24th** or you cannot participate in the event
- **Eligibility:** Not all categories require a **Sewing Project**.
- **Members may enter up to 2 modeling categories plus the quilting challenge.** Members may enter two categories at State Fashion Revue. The garments and accessories for each modeling outfit must be distinctly different. An item in one outfit may not also be used as part of another outfit. Quilt challenge entries will be judged while on display.
- **Members entering in two modeling categories** will be judged in each outfit separately which may require a few quick outfit changes. **Please be aware of this ahead of time and plan accordingly.**

PHOTO SHOOT

After participants have their time with the judges they will have a phot shoot with a professional photographer.



Instructions for Members:

- Complete the General and Supplemental Entry Forms. Forms are online at: <https://link.ucanr.edu/co4hfashionrevue>
- A completed entry form includes:
 - **Traditional:** completed supplemental entry form and 2x2 sample of each fabric used
 - **Consumer Science - Purchased \$50 limit:** attach photocopies of your receipts for all items showing and completed supplemental entry form
 - **Uniquely Upcycled:** completed supplemental entry form
 - **Pantone Color of the Year 2025 Challenge:** completed supplemental entry form
 - **Softie Challenge:** completed supplemental entry form
 - **Costume Challenge:** completed supplemental entry form
 - **Needlework:** completed supplemental entry form
- *Photos of your completed garment are not mandatory, but are required if you are eligible to participate in State Fashion Revue.*
- **Commentary:** IF there are enough entries we will have a fashion show. Must be at least 10 entries. Your commentary will be read as you walk across the stage during the fashion show. It is what you want to tell others about your project and describes what you are modeling. Members must write their own commentary—the 4-H Office and Fashion Revue Committee are not responsible for writing your commentary. **If you enter two categories, you must submit two separate commentaries.**



Instructions for Members (con't):

- Pay your entry fee online, give to your clothing leader or bring in to the 4-H Office.
- Enter online then submit the above materials to your clothing project leader or the office by **Friday, April 24th**.
- **Members requiring special arrangements due to disability, please explain on registration form or contact the 4-H Office.**

PLEASE NOTE: If we do not have 10 entries, entries will still be judged but no fashion show.

Instructions for Project Leaders:

- Distribute the enclosed materials to your project members.
- Make sure all participating members complete their online entry by **April 14th**.
- Collect receipts, completed supplemental forms and/or pictures (according to what category entered).
- Place in the envelope provided and submit to the 4-H office by **April 24th**.

Divisions and Judging

AGE DIVISIONS (as of 12/31/2025)

- Primary members: Age 5 - 8 Note: Primary Members will not be judged but they will get an opportunity for feedback on their outfits/projects. They are **not eligible to participate at State Fashion Revue** in May.
- Junior: Age 9 - 10
- Intermediate: Age 11 - 13
- Senior: Age 14 - 18 (A member is eligible to participate as a senior until Dec 31st of the calendar year in which they turn 19.)

JUDGING

- Participants are divided by county, age division, and category for judging.
- Judging is on overall appearance and expression of personal style while wearing their outfits.
- Participants will briefly tell the judges what they made or purchased and what they learned. **They should be prepared to answer questions** from the judges. The judges will review the entry forms and accompanying information.
- Judging is closed to the public.

AWARDS

- All entries will be judged by the Danish System.
- Each participant will receive a certificate and a participation pin.
- Additional awards may be given in each age division, in each category, including donated gifts.
- Awards are based on merit, as determined by the judges. If there is only one entry in a category, it does not automatically warrant an award.



ATTENTION: (Applies to all categories)

- The outfit must be produced and modeled by the individual member.
- To be in alignment with State Fashion Revue: All outfits must meet the [4-H Dress Guidelines](#).
- All shorts, skirts, dresses, etc. must be at least fingertip length.
- Each entry a member enters should be distinctly different.



2026 Categories

County Winners from the following categories are eligible to compete at State Fashion Review.

1. TRADITIONAL:

Features garments the participant has constructed, showcasing sewing skills and the ability to coordinate an outfit. **The entry must be sewn by the member as part of his/her 4-H Clothing and Textiles project** and modeled by the member. The outfit must contain at least one constructed garment. Participants are encouraged to construct additional garments to complete the outfit.

2. CONSUMER SCIENCE PURCHASED, \$50.00 LIMIT:

Participants in this category will shop for an entire outfit with the total cost not to exceed \$50.00, including shoes but not sales tax. Receipts from the current 4-H year are required for any item that is visible. Gifts, prior purchases, and items without receipts are not eligible for this category. Receipts from yard sales, etc. may be hand written. The member should consider value vs. cost, versatility, the shopping experience, and coordination of the outfit within the cost limit. **There is no 4-H project requirement and must be modeled by the member; any 4-H member may enter this category.**

3. UNIQUELY UPCYCLED:

In the context of fashion, upcycling involves repurposing old clothing or textiles to create new and unique garments. This can include combining different pieces of a garment or other materials to create a fresh look. You can alter the items through sewing, embellishing, painting, dyeing, etc. **This garment/s in this category must be sewn by the member as part of a 4-H Clothing & Textiles Project* and modeled by the member at the Fashion Revue event.**



4. PANTONE COLOR OF THE YEAR 2025 CHALLENGE

Participants in this challenge will create an outfit that uses the Pantone Color of the Year 2025: Mocha Mousse, a warming, soft brown that evokes comfort, thoughtfulness, and simple pleasures. It reflects a desire for ease and coziness and to nourish ourselves with life's simple pleasures, whether it's a quiet moment with a cup of tea or a peaceful walk in nature. Additional colors may be used to enhance the outfit. The outfit must feature at least one handmade garment made by the member. The garment/s in **this category must be sewn by the member as part of a 4-H Clothing & Textiles Project** and modeled by the member at the Fashion Revue event.



2026 Categories *Con't*

5. SOFTY CHALLENGE:

Members create a stuffed animal, cloth doll, plush toy, soft sculpture, or fabric toy. In this challenge, the participant will sew, felt, knit, or crochet a softie using a pattern or their own design. Any type of fabric and any embellishment techniques (trims, embroidery, yarn hair, removeable clothing) may be used. Participant must present the entry themselves at the Fashion Revue event. **This category has no 4-H project requirement and must be shown by the member at the Fashion Revue event.**



6. COSTUME CHALLENGE:

Participants in this category will create a costume for themselves or another person using any technique, materials, or pattern. It does not need to be sewn from fabric. The costume can be any theme and from any time, place, or country as long as it is 4-H appropriate. 70% of the costume must be handmade by the member; 30% can be handmade or purchased. The member must be able to move comfortably in the costume - sit, stand, walk, and go up and down stairs. This category has **no 4-H project requirement**. If it was sewn for the member, they must model it. If it was sewn for another person, that person may model it, or it may be shown on a hanger. The member must be present and participate at the Fashion Revue event if it was sewn for another person.



7. NEEDLEWORK:

Participants in this category will create any type of needlework – embroidery, cross stitch, needlepoint, quilting, knitting, crochet, etc. You may use a kit. **The item/s in this category must be sewn by the member as part of a 4-H Clothing & Textiles Project* and shown by the member at the Fashion Revue event.**
