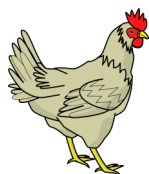

What: The 4-H Avian Bowl Contest is a knowledge-based quiz bowl focusing on poultry specific topics including breeds, biosecurity, genetics, embryology, management, and scientific advancement. The Avian Bowl is a double-elimination, tournament-style format where teams (2-4 youth) compete in rounds or "games" using a light-up, buzzer system to answer questions and earn points for their team.

Who: Open to **ALL** 4-H youth Age 9 to 18

Teams: Youth are encouraged to form a team of 2-4 members in either the **Junior Division** (9-13 years old) or **Senior Division** (14-18 years old). The Senior Division is a **state qualifier** for the National 4-H Avian Bowl Contest!

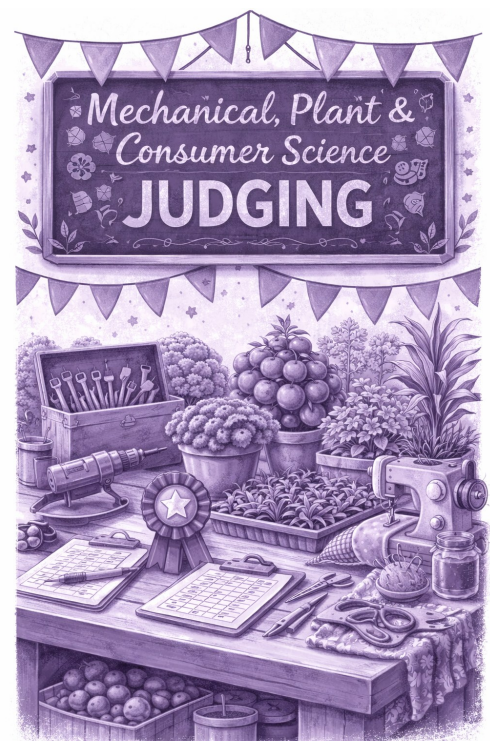

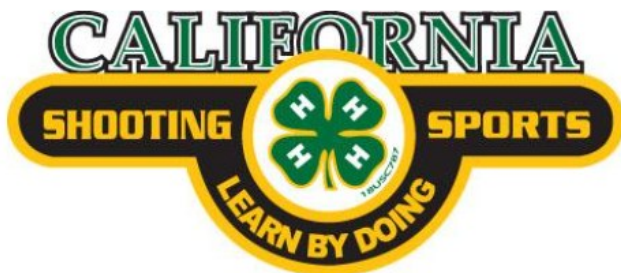
