Key:

The dates in **BLUE** are when seeds should be sown. The dates in **YELLOW** are when these crops will be harvested. For instance, a crop that is sown at date **1** can be harvested at date **1**.

Winter Tips:

Grow cover crops in any space that isn't cropped over the winter. Keep off the garden soil as much as possible. Apply a straw mulch around crops once they are big enough that slugs won't eat them. Starting in October, use floating row covers over outdoor lettuce, spinach, carrots, radish, cilantro, and dill.
