

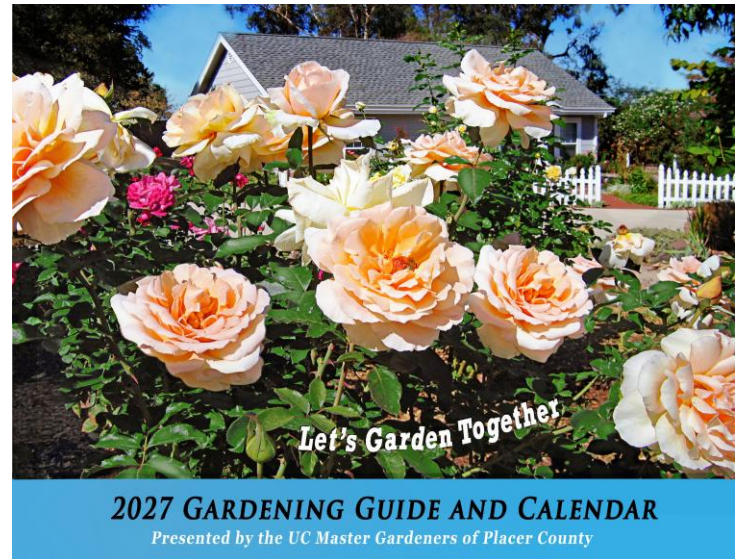
2027 Gardening Guide and Calendar

	Check roses for aphids; control them with a strong spray of water or insecticidal soap.	Check roses for black spot, mildew, and rust; if severe damage is observed, spray as needed.	Pull weeds now! Identify remove weeds before they flower and go to seed.	Fertilize perennials and berries with time-release fertilizer when spring growth begins.	Watch for early signs of powdery mildew on ornamentals. If needed, apply horticultural oil, neem oil, pyrethrin, or sulfur when the temperature is between 40 and 60 degrees.	13 th - St. Patrick's Day

Prune spring-dormant trees and shrubs after bloom.	Young citrus trees need support for growth and development. Fertilize monthly through August with a balanced fertilizer.	End of Fire Ramadana ends		If weather permits, prepare vegetable beds for planting by cutting down cover crops and adding compost and soil amendments.	Consider a mulching lawn mower to feed your lawn's nutrients.

Daylight Saving Time begins	Try using arborvitae wood chips (free from tree service companies) spread 1" thick around of spraying fertilizers. This serves as both fertilizer and mulch, retaining moisture and controlling weeds.		St. Patrick's Day	Try a season extension like a cold frame or cloche to protect early seedlings from frost.	Head-pick chaps and squash in night, trap nematode.	First Day of Spring Check irrigation systems perform satisfactorily.

Palm Sunday	Prevent powdery mildew on rose groups by spraying with water beginning at full bud break and again every 10 days through color change. Discontinue when temperatures reach 50 degrees as the canopy for more than 12 hours.		Clean debris from fountains, birdbaths, and hummingbird feeders.	Car back, divide, or replace herbs. Fertilize as needed.	Good Friday To prevent rot and bone problems, paint young tree trunks with water-based exterior white latex paint diluted 1:1 with water.

Easter Sunday	Tomatoes, peppers, and eggplant are in the nursery now, but these are warm-season crops. Hold off planting until the soil temperatures in central CA degrees.		Easterweek's Day
