Instructions for the KWL

Depending on the age of your students, a KWL can be completed with the whole class, in small groups, or by individual children.

- 1. Determine the learning objectives for your trip to Elkus Ranch.
- 2. Direct the students' attention to the **K** above the first column which stands for "Know". Ask what they already know about your topic and record their comments. If students dispute whether an item is true or not, it sometimes helps to rephrase it as a question and place it in the 2nd column.
- 3. Now direct the students to the **W** above the second column which stands for "What?" Ask the students to share their questions (What would you like to know?) about your topic that they hope to have answered at the ranch. Please share these first two columns with your educator at the ranch on the day of your visit.
- 4. After your visit to the ranch, direct students back to the KWL. Read each statement in the first column and determine if it is true or false based on what they learned at the ranch. Correct any misinformation. Review the questions from the second column and record students' answers. Identify any information that may require further research from both columns.
- 5. Record any new learning in the L column (What did we Learn?)
- 6. Unconfirmed statements in the K columns, unanswered questions in the **W** columns, and new questions generated after your ranch visit make great research projects for your students. We are happy to participate. Encourage students to write us a letter with their questions and we will do our best to answer.
