



California State-Certified Prescribed Fire Burn Boss (CARX)

Intended for experienced prescribed or cultural fire practitioners who wish to be recognized by the state for their knowledge and expertise. Could include retired fire professionals, landowners and community members, NGO staff, private contractors, tribal members and cultural burners, state and local agency staff, and others.

STEPS TO CERTIFICATION

- 1. Meet program pre-requisites
- 2. Take <u>40-hour in-person CARX class</u>
- 3. Complete task book and receive evaluations from qualified evaluators
- 4. Final signature and certification by CAL FIRE/State Fire Training

BENEFITS OF CERTIFICATION

- Recognition/validation by the state
- Ability to share liability with CAL FIRE on specific projects through a cooperative agreement process
- Ability to review and approve burn plans, as required by <u>SB332</u> in order to apply a gross negligence standard for fire suppression costs
- Recognition by the Natural Resources Conservation Service for EQIP- and other NRCS-funded burn plan development and Rx fire implementation
- Access to \$2 million in liability coverage through California's new <u>Prescribed Fire</u> <u>Claims Fund</u>.
- Building capacity of your local <u>prescribed fire</u> <u>community</u>!
