 - Minimum age limit of 20 months and a maximum of 30 months old at the Fair.
- Beef Replacement Heifer Paperwork Deadline: Wednesday, January 20, 2025, due to the Glenn Couty Fair
- Breeding Dates:
 - Spring Calving Heifers: Bred April 25, 2024 July 9, 2024, to calve between February 1, 2025, and April 17, 2025.
 - Fall Calving Heifers: Bred November 16, 2024 January 23, 2025, to calve between August 15, 2025, and November 1, 2025.
- All heifers past 25 months of age must calve by Saturday, November 1, 2024.
