Tuesday September 3, 2024

- Flag Salute was led by Clare Curtis and 4-H Pledge was led by Adeleigh Sayles
- **Secretary's Report/Minutes** – on a motion from Clare Curtis, seconded by Lilly Pimentel, minutes from the August meeting were approved.
- **Treasurer's Report**- Lilly Pimentel reviewed the Treasurer's Report which was then approved on a motion by Cobi Revious, seconded by Clare Curtis.
- **Club Reports**
 - Corcoran 4-H – 1st meeting will be a swim party on September 21st
 - Grangeville 4-H – August 24th was an informal meeting including a BBQ and officer nominations and the first regular meeting and officer elections will be held on September 10
 - Kings Harvest 4-H – 1st meeting and officer installation was September 1st and there were five new families in attendance
 - Kings River 4-H – 1st meeting is September 9th and an officer and planning meeting was held in August. The club participated in Back to School Night at distributed flyers at Kings River.
