Keep Bacteria Off Your Menu

Thanksgiving is a special time for giving thanks and focusing on family and friends. However, the improper storing, cooking and serving of roast turkey can lead to the growth of harmful bacteria like salmonella, which can cause foodborne illness.



Here are some tips that cooks in the kitchen can follow this holiday season:

- Thaw a frozen turkey in the refrigerator. Allow 1 day for each five pounds of turkey. Be sure to remove neck and giblets from the inside of the bird as soon as possible. Cook fresh turkeys within 2 days, thawed ones within 4 days.
- Wash your hands with hot, soapy water before and after handling raw poultry. Do not rinse the turkey in water. Not only is rinsing your poultry before you cook ineffective at killing germs, it can actually spread them.
- Read and follow the cooking directions. Cook turkey until it is done (165 ° F). Use a meat thermometer to be sure the temperature has been reached.
- Take care with stuffing. Whether it is cooked inside or outside the bird, all stuffing and dressing must be cooked at minimum temperature of 165 ° F. For optimum safety, cooking your stuffing in a casserole dish is recommended. Stuffing should be prepared and stuffed into the turkey immediately before it's placed in the oven.
- Refrigerate foods quickly. Remember the two hour rule. Don't leave perishable food at room temperature too long, bacteria may grow and produce heat resistant toxins that can cause food-borne illness.
