Greetings Tahoe Gardeners,

My name is Sandy Gainza; I am the new editor of this UC Master Gardeners of Lake Tahoe newsletter. I hope to make this publication useful to all of you who live and garden in the Lake Tahoe region. We are approaching the summer solstice; as you watch the sun move from its southernmost position in December to the the northernmost aspect on June 21, keep in mind that the sun and shade in your garden will change throughout the year. If you plan on enjoying annual summer color or growing vegetables, the south facing side of your house will become more shady in summer than in spring or fall. This change can affect how your plants bloom and also how much irrigation they might need. Take a minute to observe where the sun is at the same time of day every so often. Knowing how much sun you actually get in any spot during our very short growing season can help you choose the right plants for each location.

This month, the Master Gardeners are busy with several projects. The "Grow Your Own" workshops are winding up, with "Tomatoes" scheduled for Wednesday, June 8 and Saturday, June 11; and "Herbs", scheduled for Wednesday, June 15. These workshops are free unless you would like to purchase accompanying plants, in which case there is a \$15 fee for the plants. Don't worry if you missed one of the earlier presentations; they are posted on YouTube and you can watch at your leisure **HERE** on the UC Master Gardeners of Lake Tahoe YouTube channel! 
Enjoy the long days and take time to savor the summer landscape!

What is a Tahoe Friendly Garden?

The Tahoe Friendly Garden Program is a non-regulatory, voluntary sign-up program administered by the UCCE Master Gardeners of Lake Tahoe. Our goal is to encourage residents of Lake Tahoe to garden in a manner that strives to fit our local



conditions. The *Tahoe Friendly Garden Program* encourages gardens that use less water, fertilizer, and pesticides, and includes a diversity of plants and landscape options.

A *Tahoe Friendly Garden* will ensure that the right plants are in the right place.

## Tahoe Friendly Garden Elements:

• <u>Water Conservation</u>: Conserve your time and resources by being water-wise! Choose appropriate plants for Tahoe's climate and utilize efficient irrigation systems.

- <u>Beneficial Wildlife Habitat</u>: Living in harmony with wildlife. Consider the pros and cons of which critters you want to invite in your yard. Berries, seeds, and leaves are an important food source for birds, mammals and beneficial insects and plants provide nesting materials and shelter from predators and the elements.
- <u>Soil Fertility</u>. The garden's foundation. Soil health enhances water infiltration and storage while allowing your garden to thrive.
- Wildfire Safety: Garden for your 3 Tahoe fire defensible space zones. Minimize the risk of wildfire by reducing the amount of flammable vegetative material in your home landscape and eliminate it near structures.
- <u>Home-grown food:</u> A little knowledge and practice with climate and growing seasons, soil conditions, moisture, and pest control can help you grow your own vegetables and join the grow-your-own movement.

Tahoe Friendly Garden Elements into Action... We've created a certification program to:

- Reward Tahoe gardeners for their positive efforts!
- Encourage Tahoe residents and visitors to appreciate <u>native</u> and adapted plants.
- Make gardening fun!
- Keep Tahoe naturally beautiful!
