All entries must be made online; no paper entries will be accepted. Link to the online entry system is listed below under item #1. Entries are \$7.00 each class. Entry fees are non-refundable. All required paperwork must be downloaded, signed and given to the show committee day of the show, along with entry fee paid in cash or check. Day of entries will be accepted for an additional fee. Payment for day of entries will be received at the show. Checks should be made out to Nevada County 4-H.

**Educational Poster Contest:** The educational poster contest can be entered online and be of any horse related topic. Please see the Poster Contest description in the entry system for additional details and directions. The Poster Contest fee is \$5 per poster. Members may submit more than one poster. Poster entries will be accepted day of for an additional fee of \$5.

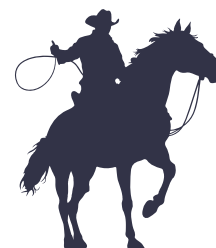

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# NEVADA COUNTY 4-H SCHOOLING HORSE SHOW RULES

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**Must be an active California 4-H Member or FFA Member (FFA must have insurance)**

- 4-H Horse project is not a requirement.
- Must be 9 years old as of January 1 of the 4-H enrollment year.
- Properly fitted, certified (ASTM & SEI) helmets, with chin straps, are required.
- 4-H uniform and FFA organizational uniform for showing:
  - Long white pants, breeches or jodhpurs are required.
  - Proper riding boots (pull on, smooth bottom, 1 inch heel) No lace up boots.
  - Belt
  - Collared shirt that tucks in
- All members are to bring their own buckets for watering their horses. It is unsafe to share buckets or watering troughs with unknown horses.
- Participants entered in walk/trot classes may not enter walk/trot/lope classes.
- All participants must sign a Martine's Ranch Riding Release.
- FFA participants must sign 4-H Waiver of Liability.

## Western & Ranch

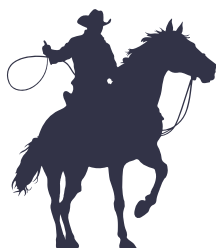
- Split reins or romal reins permitted in Western classes.
- Horses must show in a halter for Showmanship classes. Chains permitted.
- No Sport boots, bell boots, splint boots or polos. Bell boots will be permitted for Ranch Classes.
- No gag bits or training devices are allowed
- Horses ridden with a snaffle bit must be ridden two handed\*. Horses ridden with a shank bit must be ridden one-handed. \*Note that State show will require one handed riding with shank bit for horses 5 years and older.
- All tack should be clean and in working order.

## English

- Whips or crops may be used with discretion.
- Horses may be shown in Halter for Showmanship Classes.
- Breastplates are permitted.
- Jumping classes (if scheduled for the show), will allow the use of protective leg ware and boots. Leg protection and training devices are not permitted in any other English Classes.
- All tack should be clean and in working order.

## Safety Policy

- At the Judges discretion, any rider and horse may be excused from a class if deemed "out of control" or unsafe. This will result in disqualification from that class.
- Any horse showing signs of lameness may be excused from a class. Head bobbing, limping or signs of discomfort will not be acceptable in classes. This will result in disqualification.
- Any rider that needs to dismount during a class, gets bucked off or falls off during a class is disqualified from that individual class.





# SCHEDULE OF EVENTS

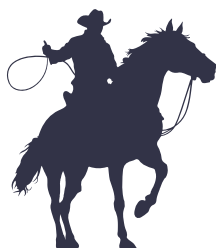


- 7:30 am Gates open for trailer arrival
