In October, Martha Humber of Placer County 4-H had the opportunity to travel to St. Louis, Missouri to attend the National Junior Horticultural Association (NJHA) Convention. Martha qualified to serve on the California 4-H team, participating in team competitions such as a plant science test, horticultural connections, and an educational state display. In addition to serving on the California 4-H team who won the horticultural connections competition, Martha also gave a speech called "I Spy A Bonsai", entered a poem in writing in horticulture, did a promotional design, completed a botanical illustration, and submitted several photographs. Martha received Grand National prizes for her speech and poem; National, Grand National Best Overall photography; and the highest score overall in the plant science test. Martha shared, "I know that I have had a spark for gardening ever since the 4-H Junior Master Gardener project. I know I would still garden even if I had never heard about NJHA, but NJHA has definitely inspired me. I already have the goal to collect a complete seed kit, compete in Honors as soon as possible, and get other kids involved as well."
