But you're a farmer, not a "communicator."

So why social media?

By giving entrepreneurs free access to their audience, services such as Twitter and Facebook are putting [small businesses] on a par with behemoths such as Starbucks and Dell when it comes to <u>broadcasting messages</u> to a mass market. They have also created what Steve Hasker of Nielsen calls 'the world's biggest, fastest and most dynamic focus groups,' which can be a boon to entrepreneurs without fat research budgets. "

This is your primary "content"


Make sure to have some content before promoting your new page.

You can type a status update directly over the question, "What's on your mind?"


(max text = 420 characters) (micro-blogging or 3x a tweet)



And/or you can choose to "attach" more information



... best for use with pertinent associations, most dangerous with competitors. Avoid spamming!


