

Club Model	4-H Community Club	Practice decision-making and participate in diverse educational activities related to club projects and governance & develop mastery of a specific content, generally over a shorter period of time
	4-H Community SPIN Club	Practice decision-making and participate in diverse educational activities yearlong related to club projects and governance
	4-H In-School Club	Organized in-school settings, provide educational content and lessons designed to complement, meet and/or enhance the school's core curriculum
	4-H In-School SPIN Club	Organized in-school setting, provide educational content and lessons designed to complement, meet and/or enhance the school's core curriculum & develop mastery of a specific content, generally over a shorter period of time
	4-H Afterschool Club	Organized in and afterschool setting, provide opportunities to youth to learn valuable skills and lifelong benefits and contribute to their community through "hands-on" project-based learning
	4-H Afterschool SPIN Club	Organized in and afterschool setting , provide opportunities to youth to learn valuable skills and lifelong benefits and contribute to their community through "hands-on" project-based learning & develop mastery of a specific content, generally over a shorter period of time.
	4-H Military Club	Organized on Military installations for military dependents, Youth receive 4-H YDP curricula or other educational materials. Military staff are trained by CE staff or 4-H Adult Volunteers.
	4-H Military SPIN Club	Organized on Military installations for military dependents Youth receive 4-H YDP curricula or other educational materials. Military staff are trained by CE staff or 4-H Adult Volunteers.
