OCTOBER EVENTS CELEBRATING 4-H!

"4-H SHOWCASE" for National 4-H Week at SLO Farmers Market 10/5/23 & 4-H Achievement Night 10/21/23

4-H SHOWCASE at SLO Farmers Market on Thursday, October 5th 2023. To celebrate National 4-H Week October 1st — 7th
The THEME is "How our Youth Lead the Way"

All 4-H Clubs in SLO County are invited to participate in the Farmers Market event in San Luis Obispo on Thursday, October 5th! Each 4-H Club can set up a Pop-Up Booth or a Table Display to "showcase" information about your 4-H Club, the projects you offer, Leadership, and Community Service your club participates in. Best Spirit of 4-H, most informative, most "How our Youth Lead the Way" theme, and most club members attending. You must provide lighting that is acceptable to the Farmers Market requirements — details below. This Farmers Market night is before Daylight-savings-time so we will have some light. Additional activities will include Presentations. 4-H Members in the Dog Care project are welcome to perform an Obedience class presentation and the Poultry and Rabbit project members are welcome to demonstrate how the animals are shown and judged. Two tables will be provided for these demonstrations. Pygmy goat project members are welcome to demonstrate a showmanship class. All small animals participating have been approved by Farmers Market to attend this event. The requirement is that all waste products must be properly removed by the member.

Listed below are the Instructions and Information regarding approved items for Lighting: Please Note: Item # 2 below needs to be approved first before it is brought to Farmers Market on CHORRO Street— send your request to Denise Harris at the 4-H Office and she will forward it to the correct person. Generator Rules:

- 1. We discourage the use of gas-powered generators and encourage battery operated lighting or something like these:
- CAT 1200
- Duracell Power Block
- 2. If you need to use a gas-powered generator, they must be whisper-silent (below 55dB at full capacity), and the Make and Model must be submitted to SLO Downtown Farmers Market for review and approval send an email to Denise Harris at the 4-H Office.
- 3. If you just need lights, most vendors use battery-operated LED desk lamps/clamp-style lights to illuminate the tents. Some examples:

Edna 4-H, Creston 4-H, or SLO Co Riders 4-H





County Program Technician (PT) located for the San Luis County FSA office in Templeton.

The Mission of the FSA County Office

County Offices are the direct link between the Farm Service Agency and local farmers and ranchers. County Offices are responsible for administering Agency programs at the local level, for providing guidance and assistance to program participants and others, and for leading outreach efforts to explain and promote Agency programs through public events and media presentations.

Responsibilities:

- Carrying out office activities and functions pertaining to one or more of the program areas administered in the county.
- Interpreting and explaining procedures, program regulations and forms to producers and other agency personnel.
- Utilizing various web-based software applications to maintain producer data and processing automated forms.
- Using a high degree of initiative and judgment in planning and carrying out assigned tasks and resolving problems encountered.

How to Qualify:

Applicants for CO-04 positions must meet one of the sets of qualifications listed below:

- Two years of education above high school at an accredited college or university, or
- At least one year of general experience of progressively responsible clerical office work, or equal background in the operations of a farm or ranch that indicates the ability to acquire the particular knowledge, skills, and abilities needed to perform the duties of this position, or
- A combination of education and experience described above.

Applicants for CO-05 positions must meet one of the sets of qualifications listed below:

- Four years of education above high school at an accredited college or university, or
- At least one year of *specialized experience equivalent to the grade 5 level or above, or
- A combination of education and experience described above.

Advancement Opportunities:

- CO grade levels are fully equivalent to GS grade levels.
- The grade progression for PTs is CO-4/5/6/7. Most employees are eligible for advancement to the next higher grade after one year.

Benefits:

- 13 days paid vacation per year for the first 3 years with a limit of 240 hours carryover per year. Vacation days increase after 3 years and 15 years of service.
- 13 days paid sick leave per year with an unlimited carryover per year
- 11 paid Federal holidays per year
 on the job and formal training
 health insurance, life insurance, retirement benefits and Thrift Savings Plan

 * Specialized experience is experience with FSA or other USDA agencies, State departments of agriculture, State or local extension services, or vocational agriculture schools where the candidate has acquired knowledge of the operational phases of farm programs, or farm credit programs, carried out by the respective agencies or institutions.
