

- a) A fatal disease caused by toxins produced by Clostridium tetani.

- d) Contagious disease of sheep and goats caused by bacteria called Corynebacterium pseudotuberculosis.
- e) Contagious disease of the eyes caused by several kinds of bacteria.
- f) A very common disease caused by one of several protozoal parasites of the intestinal tract of goats.
- g) They are internal and external eg. worms, protozoa, bots, lice.
- h) Two different syndromes caused by a C.A.E. virus, most often spread from doe to kid through colostrum and milk.
