

County 4-H Council Meeting
May 18, 2020
Video Conference - 7PM

The meeting was called to order at 7:04 pm by Theresa Jaramillo.

The County Ambassadors did the flag salute and 4-H pledge.

Kaitlyn took roll. Attendees were Canada, BSM, Belmont, San Carlos, Pacifica, San Bruno, San Mateo Park.

Kaitlyn gave the secretary report, which Bunny Weiss and Kruthi approved.

Keith Farkas gave the treasurers report. As of 4/30 the checking account had \$ [REDACTED] and the Money Market account had \$ [REDACTED].

Jeff Richardson gave the 4-H summer camp report. It will not be known until after June 1st if camp will be cancelled or not but as of 5/18 44 people have registered, currently their checks are being held, and they are currently accepting more registrations. If there is no camp held this year all staff will be returning into the same positions next year but there will be more ADs and previous campers may be promoted to manager.

Belmont gave the pen pride report. The pigs current weights are 213 and 190.

Bunny Weiss gave the lifeskills report. She said that there will be a virtual fashion review and more information would be released soon.

The county virtual livestock show was presented on by Zeva Cho, Theresa Jaramillo, and Keith Farkas. It was proposed to send \$75 to Kaiser Hospice to honor Bill Rodgers, who recently passed. He was super involved in 4-H and at the fair and helped create the kitchen area at fair. There was no opposition to sending the \$75.

Theresa Jaramillo presented on the Pen Pride Donation proposal. It was suggested that it would be split between all clubs. Bunny Weiss and Jeff Richardson agreed.

Theresa Jaramillo then held County Council Elections. Enika Patel, a senior member from Belmont, was elected as Secretary, and Dan Hogan was elected as Vice President.

Zeva Cho gave the county office general announcements. She said that California 4-H is putting out tips on different things at this time, State advisory committee applications are due May 31, State field days will be virtual and held on May 24, and the County Record Book Evaluation has been pushed out. Zeva also noted that even though the fair cancelled youth may not sell their livestock through a raffle as that is illegal.

The county ambassadors gave their final project report of the year. They reported that they are working on mask collection and donation as well as the drawing contest.

The meeting was Adjourned at 8:15 pm, with a first by Bunny Weiss and a second by Jeff Richardson.
