- Create deeper impact

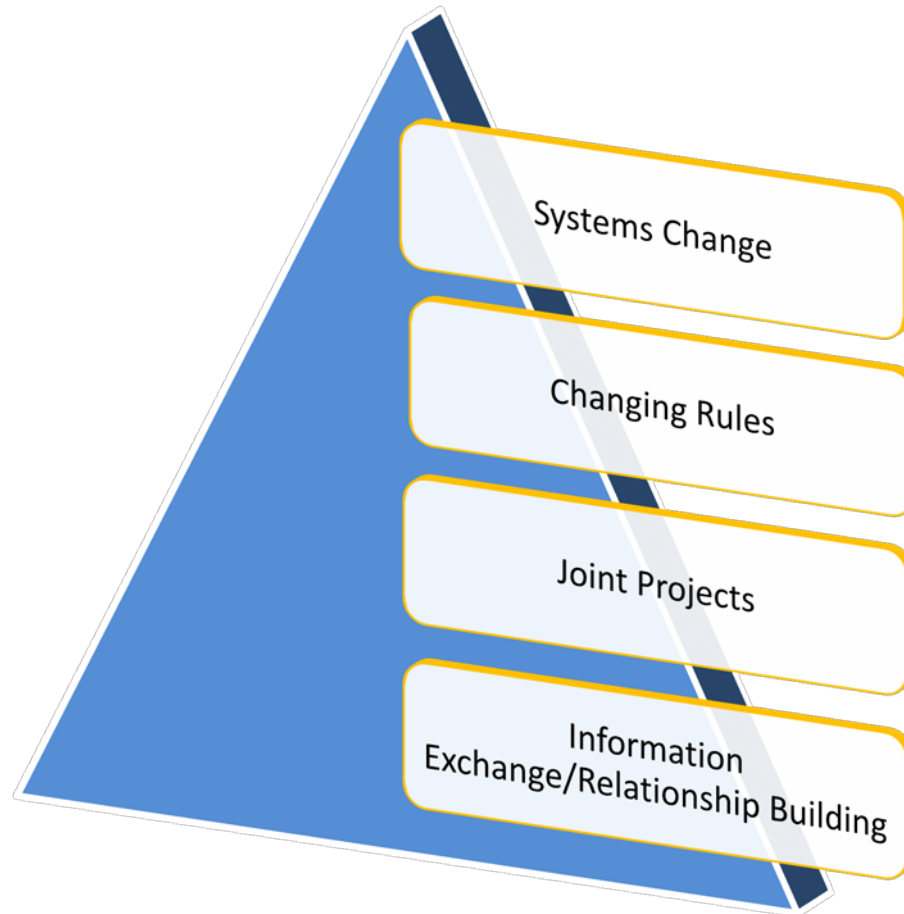


What is Collaboration?
