CAL FIRE Business and Workforce Development Grants Solicitation. CAL FIRE's Wood Products and Bioenergy team has opened their Business and Workforce Development Grants solicitation. The Wood Products team seeks to maintain and enhance the forest-sector workforce and businesses of California to promote healthy resilient forests throughout the state by supporting a diverse set of business development and workforce development projects. - Eligible business development projects include facilities, operations, and professional services that support the restoration of healthy, resilient forests. - Eligible workforce development projects include universities, colleges, government and community organizations, and businesses that aim to increase workforce capacity in the fields of logging, fuels treatment, transportation, manufacturing, or other support services that bolster the development of a resilient forest sector workforce. - Research and development projects related to both business and workforce development will also be considered.

NCRP Solicitation for Project Development Technical Assistance. The North Coast Resource Partnership (NCRP) is pleased to offer project development technical assistance through the NCRP Regional Forest & Fire Capacity program and other funding programs for projects that improve forest health, increase wildfire resiliency, address drinking water, watershed health and wastewater needs, and help communities and ecosystems address and adapt to climate change. The purpose of this technical assistance support opportunity is to help build projects that are competitive for upcoming funding and implementation opportunities. Direct technical assistance will be provided by a team of regional experts and may include site assessment, mapping and GIS analysis, greenhouse gas calculations, cost estimates, permitting support, project benefits quantification and preliminary project design. Concept proposal solicitations for project development technical assistance will be accepted on a rolling basis through April 2022, and reviewed periodically.

Synthesis Report on the links between Wildfire, Forest Policy, and Public Health. The <u>California Council</u> on <u>Science and Technology</u> (CCST) and <u>Blue Forest Conservation</u> (Blue Forest) have received funding
