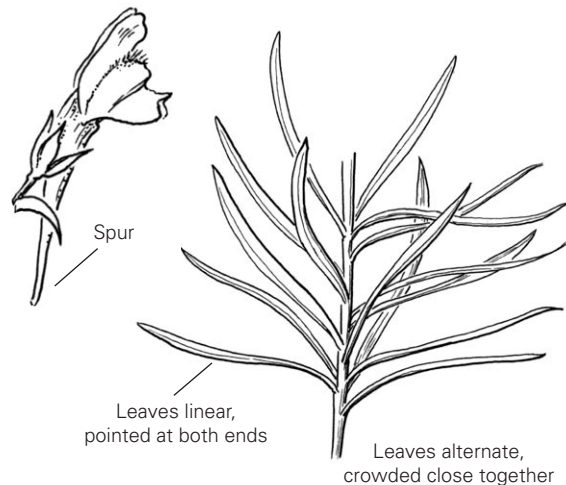




Also Known As	Butter and eggs
Origin	Nonnative, invasive
Habitat	Rangelands, roadsides, waste places, cultivated fields
Life Cycle	Perennial
Flowering Time	July to fall
Management	Pull or dig for several years, removing as much root as possible; do not mow; chemical control is available
Noxious Weed List	Nevada-YES; California-NO



- Height: 1 - 2 ft; shorter than dalmatian toadflax
- Leaves: linear, smooth to sparsely hairy; succulent and waxy
- Growth form: tends to grow in crowded patches
- Flower color: yellow, with orange, bearded throat
