Overview and Objective:

The Emerald Star rank is intended to provide an engaging and meaningful 4-H experience for youth members, in 7th grade and up, who are ready for larger leadership roles, but who do not yet meet the state's grade requirement for County Ambassador.

Eligibility:

The Emerald Star candidate will:

- Be in grade 7 or above
- Have achieved the Silver Star rank OR the equivalent requirements to earning a Silver Star rank
- Have served as a Junior or Teen Leader
- Have completed 20 hours of community service

Program:

To achieve the Emerald Star rank, the member must do the following:

1. Encourage young members to do a Rainbow Star record book OR serve as a Rainbow Star record book evaluator.
2. Serve in Community Service Leadership either as the organizer of a club level or county-wide community service event/project.
3. Assist on the planning committee for a county-wide event such as Achievement Day, Presentation Day, Farm Day, or the West Marin Fair.
4. Volunteer Service at a local fair or Farm Day
5. Attend a Youth Summit (optional, but highly recommended.)
6. Completion of an Emerald Star project.

To Apply:

The application and Emerald Star Plan of Action is submitted to the Marin County Incentives and Recognition Committee with signed approval by the applicant's mentor and Community Club Leader. The final report is due when the project is complete with a brief report to the Marin 4-H County Council at the Council meeting.
