## Marin County 2020-2021 4-H Adult Volunteer Initial Appointment Process

- 1. Find a local 4-H Club at <http://ucanr.edu/marin4h>**  
Contact the leader to obtain more information about 4-H.
- 2. Complete the interest survey at <http://ucanr.edu/marinvolunteer>.**
- 3. Submit 4-H adult volunteer application online at <https://ca.4honline.com>.**  
Create a family profile, add a new adult enrollment, enter all required information, and submit. 4hOnline adult status will show as pending.
- 4. Complete required “2020-2021 California New Volunteer Training” in eXtension.**  
Go to <https://campus.extension.org/enrol/index.php?id=1867>. Create a new account, check your email and click on the confirmation link, log into eXtension and click “2020-21 California New Volunteer Training” and enter the code “**Marin**”. Courses include: (a) 4-H Volunteer Orientation (4 modules), (b) Foundations of Positive Youth Development (1 module), (c) Toward an Interculturally Connected 4-H (3 modules), and (d) Abuse Risk Management for Volunteers (1 module); Completion Time: 3 hours. (\*Note: Every individual must use their own unique email address. For technical support, contact [idevelopsupport@ucanr.edu](mailto:idevelopsupport@ucanr.edu)). - 5. Submit \$24 by credit card online at <http://ucanr.edu/marinpay> or by check to 4-H Club Leader or Volunteer Enrollment Coordinator**
- 6. Complete fingerprint background check – Live Scan – with the California Department of Justice.** Complete at any location that provides Live Scan. Fees vary between \$20 and \$60 depending on the provider. Ask your 4-H Club Leader or Volunteer Enrollment Coordinator which location they recommend.

- 7. The application is reviewed by the county director.** If approved, notification will be sent from 4hOnline. If there are any limitations on the appointment, a subsequent letter will be sent. If not approved, a letter will be sent to you from the county director.

Until your enrollment is approved, you are not authorized to conduct any 4-H meetings or activities, transport 4-H members, or perform other 4-H adult volunteer duties.
