

Bilingual Landscaping Class Syllabus, 2024

Welcome! The Spanish Bilingual Landscaping Class is intended for professional landscapers in the North Bay who want to develop their business, or for someone aiming to get a job in professional landscaping. Because class size is limited, we respectfully request that only those interested in pursuing a career in landscaping apply.

This class held on Tuesday nights, from 6-8:30pm. You will have the option to attend in person and via Zoom, there are two hands-on classes on Saturday (masks and social distancing required) as follows:

31 January	Introduction to Sustainability

21 February	Trees and shrubs: Growth, planting & pruning
24 February (Saturday)	Trees and shrubs Practice
28 February	Irrigation #1
6 March	Irrigation #2 How much water + controllers
9 March (Saturday)	Irrigation Practice Scheduling
13 March	Turf & Fertilizers
20 March	Right plant right place
27 March	Review, fire, and home landscape

Class will be taught in simple English, with ample time for questions and clarification in Spanish. This is done to ensure that students understand and can use equivalent terms in both languages and is important for being able to effectively communicate with members of both communities. Instructors will vary from class to class.

Students must participate in all classes and both field sessions and must pass a final exam in order to receive a completion certificate. Please plan accordingly. Quizzes will be given during each class but are primarily used for attendance records. You will have two weeks to complete the take-home exam. Upon passing the final, we will post your name and preferred contact information on the Marin County UC Cooperative Extension website to support your business. If you would prefer other arrangements, please let us know during registration.
