Modoc County youth enjoyed the fine May weather as they measured, clipped, weighed, and mastered the geo-caching challenge at the Natural Resources Management 4-H Day Camp at the Avanzino Ranch on the Devil's Garden. Campers learned why Range Rocks, all about Maps & Apps and why an umbrella of sagebrush is important to survival of the Greater sage grouse.

Each participated in a number of activities to learn about range and wildlife management as well as the use of GPS (Global Positioning System) and GIS (Geographic Information System). Jeffrey Carey from New Pioneer 4-H and Maddison Seely from Surprise Valley 4-H handily won the Grand Prize of \$10 each for the geo-caching competition.

Event sponsors treated campers to a hamburger lunch as well as snacks and beverages throughout the day. 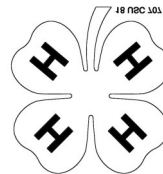
