Surprise Valley - February 16th, 10 to 11 am Location to be determined.

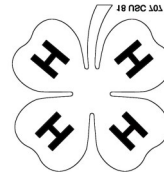
The Board discussed different options for ways to handle the taggings this year, it was decided that RSVP cards would be given out. Exhibitor's will fill out a card stating choice of location and time.
