Purpose and Guidelines

The purpose of 4-H Fashion Revue is to:

- Provide educational activities for youth who are learning and growing in citizenship, leadership and life skills.
- Inspire appreciation of clothing, textiles, consumer science, and personal development.
- Introduce opportunities to extend youth leadership and communication.
- Promote self-esteem through individual expression

Fashion Presentations and Judging -

After you register, we will contact you with a 15 minute time slot between 1:00 pm - 3:00 pm on April 17. You will join the Zoom meeting during your appointed time slot. After you join the meeting, you will be put in a breakout room to present your creation to the judges. When you are done presenting you can leave the first meeting and come back to the Zoom meeting at 3 pm for our Awards and Activities portion. You are NOT expected to be in the first zoom meeting the entire 2 hours. Participants are required to submit a 10 second video and 3 pictures of themselves modeling the outfit for the Awards/Activities presentation. Submit information to MC4HFashionRevue@gmail.com.

No Sew Categories:

Cosplay Challenge

Participants in this challenge will construct a cosplay costume. Start with a photo or drawing of the character that inspired the costume. Use any crafting techniques and any materials to make the costume. The costume and its theme must be 4-H appropriate. For instance, you can modify the Wonder Woman outfit to wear pants, tights, or a longer skirt. The participant must be able to walk, sit, and use stairs while in the costume. There is no 4-H project requirement; *any 4-H member may enter this category.*

Consumer Science Purchased, \$40.00 Limit

Participants in this category will shop for an entire outfit with the total cost not to exceed \$40.00, including shoes but not sales tax. Receipts from the current 4-H year are required for any item that is visible. The participant should consider value vs. cost, versatility, the shopping experience, and coordination of the outfit within the cost limit. There is no 4-H project requirement; *any 4-H member may enter this category.*

We will also have trivia games, a slideshow of the participant's creations, and a How to Make Your Own Mask Demonstration All 4-H members, not just Fashion Revue participants are welcome to join this event!

Monterey County Fashion Revue follows rules as established by California State Fashion Revue. [SFR Participant Information - California 4-H State Field Day](#)

1. Members may participate in multiple categories at the county level, but may only participate in one category at the State Fashion Revue.
2. Your outfit should present a "total look". Ensembles should be complete, for example including a shirt and skirt or pants, and accessories should be included.
3. All outfits must meet the [4-H Dress Guidelines](#).
4. Participants are encouraged to give a short oral presentation about their outfit. For juniors and intermediates, the time limit is 30 seconds. For seniors (changed for 2020) the time limit is 1 minute. The evaluators will also ask questions and look at the outfits.
5. Be respectful of all the volunteers including the Zoom Moderators, Judges, guests, and your peer participants.
