The purpose of Livestock Judging is to give 4-H members the opportunity to exhibit their animal evaluation & identification skills at a fair.

Each participant will review Market Swine, Market Lambs, Market Goats & Market Beef to enhance their knowledge of these species.

Goals: Members will learn about how a Livestock Judging contest would run at a local fair without being judged. Using visual techniques and accurate terminology, members will quickly learn how to identify healthy livestock that would go to a market for sale. A 4-H Member should gain enough skills to enter a Livestock Judging contest at a fair.

Format for the Livestock educational activity during the rotation:

- Each member will be given instructions by the Chualar club committee members
- The members have an opportunity to review different types of market animals that would be shown at a fair for competition
- All members will be given the proper names of livestock species and varieties
- This will be non-competitive. Members can ask questions to help learn
- Which animas would be used and what judges would be looking for in answers will shared during the rotation
- Members will be given additional resources to go over at home.
