Definition:

In a matrix, plants with similar cultural needs are grouped so that they will knit together above and below ground, forming a cooperative ecosystem that conserves water and discourages weeds. A matrix planting is designed to emulate the look and function of a natural ecosystem found in the wild. By using plants' strategies for competition, and siting plants correctly, we can create a sustainable landscape that reduces human inputs, from water to fertilizer to trimming and more — and also cuts down on maintenance.
