Red Tomatoes



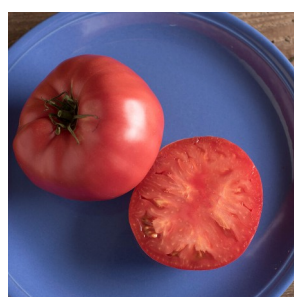
Better Boy HY, I, VFA

75 days. A mid-season deep red tomato. Weighs 1 lb. or more. Flavorful, juicy, yet firm fruit.



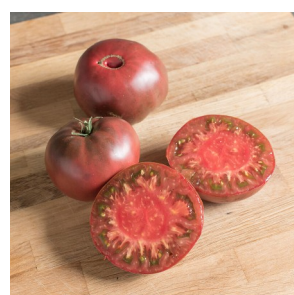
Box Car Willie HE, I

80 days. Prolific yield of reddish-orange 10-16 ozs. Use for canning, freezing, or fresh. Crack resistant.



Brandywine HE, I

78 days. Deep pink, delicious fruit, weighing one pound or more.



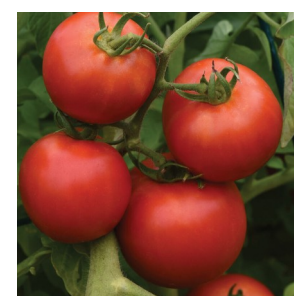
Cherokee Purple HE, I

72 days. Medium-large, 8-12 oz. fruit, rich flavor and texture. Multi-colored interior.



Celebrity Plus HY, D, AS, F, FOR, GLS, T, V, N, TSWV

78 days. Medium 7-9 oz., plump, robust, crack resistant.



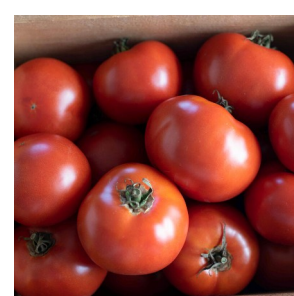
Early Girl HY, I, F, V

60 days, Heavy yield of 4-6 oz. fruit, blossom end rot and drought tolerant. Dependable favorite.



German Johnson HE, I

75 days, More vigorous, higher yielding Brandywine type pink tomato. 8-16 oz., deep acidic flavor.



Wisconsin 55 OP I, Early Blight, Septoria Resistant

80 days, 6-8 oz. Flavorful slicers, eat fresh or popular as a stewed tomato.

Other Colors



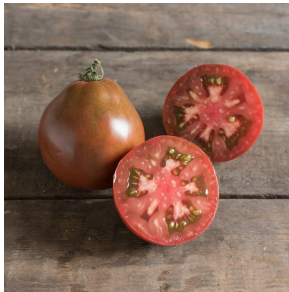
Black Krim HE I

80 days, 8-16 oz. Deep reddish-brown fruit with green shoulders.



Carbon HE I

76 days, large 10-14 oz. fruit with rich flavor and meaty texture. Resists cracking and cat-facing.



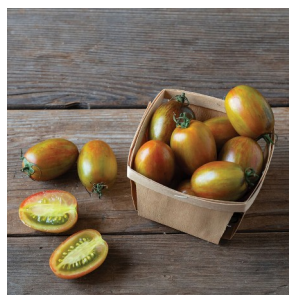
Japanese Black Trifele HE I

74 days, 4-6 oz. pear-shaped fruit. Harvest when shoulders are still green.



Kellogg's Breakfast HE I

80-85 days, Large, 16 oz. fruit, solid centers and just a few seeds near the edges.



Magic Bullet OP, I

70 days, multi-colored green, yellow, pink with indigo streaks. A great snacking tomato.



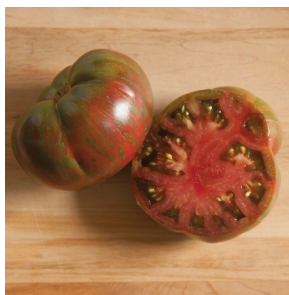
Persimmon HE, I

80 days, Very large 1 - 2 pound fruit. Meaty, delicious, only a few seeds.



Pineapple HE, I

85-90 days, enormous fruit, up to 2.5 pounds, 5" across. Mild, fruity flavor.



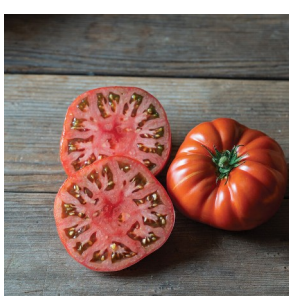
Pink Berkeley Tie Dye OP, I

70 days, 8-12 oz. fruit, green stripes, pink flesh with yellow stripes. Sweet, complex flavor.



Striped German HE, I

78 days, medium-large 12 oz. or more fruit. Marbled interior, fruity flavor, smooth texture.



Tasmanian Chocolate OP, D

75 days, 4-6 oz. fruit. Small plant, abundant flavor, great for containers.

Cherry Tomatoes



Black Cherry OP, I

64 days. Regarded as one of the best-tasting tomatoes. High yielding.



Juliet HY, I, Resistant to early, late blight

60 days. Rich tomato flavor, crack resistant, use for salads, salsa, fresh pasta sauce.



Sungold HY, I, F, T

57 days. Very sweet, vigorous plants yield early and continue throughout the season.



Sunrise Bumblebee OP, I

70 days. Sweet, tangy, premium quality snacking and salad tomato.



Washington Cherry OP, D

60 days. Thick-walled, meaty, good keeping quality off the vine.

Paste Tomatoes



Amish Paste HE, I

85 days. 8-12 oz. A meaty paste tomato with excellent flavor, also good in salads.



Blue Beech HE, I

85 days. 8-10 oz. sausage-type fruit, resists blossom end rot better than other varieties.



Roma VF OP, Semi-determinate, V, F

75 days. 2 oz. fruit, high solid to juice ratio make this an ideal sauce tomato.



San Marzano II HE, I

78 days. 4-6 oz. fruit, peel easily and cook down quickly, traditional shape and appearance.



Speckled Roman OP, I

85 days. 6- 8 oz. bright red with golden streaks. Little juice, excellent flavor.



Tiren HY, I, F Race 1, T, V

75 days. 5-6 oz. Early San Marzano type tomato. Very little gel, quickly boils down.
